- Music has an important part to play in the development of communication and language skills, including phonics (letters and sounds).
- Music is a universal language that can be enjoyed by everyone.



We are all Musicians !

- Music has a structure, with variations in pitch, pattern, sound, dynamics and rhythm.
- These are important elements that we also use when we speak.
- Our words have a rhythm forming rhymes and patterns.
- The pitch of our voice can change and we create different sounds (phonemes)
- We also speak with a steady beat that can change tempo (speed) and volume.
